Let's Talk About Vancouver By-election

Vancouver will elect two new city councillors on **April 5th.** Our new blog post goes through common by-election questions and what makes this by-election different from the rest.

Not only have two women, opposition party leaders, resigned their seats, but by-elections have historically low turnouts. This means your voting will be important because only a small group of residents determine who gets to be our city councillors.

Read, Watch, & Learn

- Decolonize your understanding of treaties and check out <u>the Yellowhead</u>
 <u>Institute Treaty Map</u>, an accessible introduction to Indigenous perspectives on treaties in Canada.
- Use <u>this letter writing tool</u> created by Society for Advocacy for Gender Affirming Healthcare (SAGAH) to ask key provincial leaders to fund universal gender-affirming healthcare in BC.
- Measure a city's walkability for babies, toddlers, their caregivers, and everyone in cities by going to Pedestrians First.
- Consider <u>filling out this questionnaire</u> if you or your child has experienced exclusion in classrooms and schools in BC's K-12 public education system.
 The Ombudsperson has begun investigation into the exclusion of students, particularly those with diverse needs.
